
area of McDowell County, West Virginia. Today, a strong retaining wall is holding the mountain back. A new bathroom and bedroom has been added. And thanks

with five other members from Toledo First spent last week in southern Appalachia, Creola has a sewer again.


Though there is no Adventist church

offerings to the conclusion of our 11AM worship service starting June 5th.

I hope doing so won't discourage the faithful contributors who in the past have cheerfully given their tithes and offerings toward the beginning of our worship service as offering plates were being passed around. Instead, my hope is that as we exit following worship under the giant cross at back of the sanctu-

ary, in response to He who looks at us and loves us, that more of us will love Him back and freely and cheerfully give back to Him.

To do so, a box with an opening at the top has been added to the foot of the cross in the back of the sanctuary for you to place your tithes and offerings on your way out of church. And should you exit on the sides of



the sanctuary, deacons with plates will be there to open the doors and offer you another option to give as well.

Aside from providing us the opportunity to give after we have received, an additional benefit of collecting our tithes and offerings this way is that people can give "secretly" all Sabbath morning long. You don't have to wait until the end of worship to give. You could place

your financial gifts in the box anytime before or during the service as well. Since giving and receiving is a personal response to our loving God, perhaps this additional benefit of anonymity will encourage others to give to our local church budget and not just our tithes remembering as we do that it takes grace to give and to receive. —Pastor Mike ##
