Blood Drive set for September 28th

We're having a Red Cross Blood Drive on Sunday afternoon, September 28, at Toledo First. Mark the date and plan to give blood if you can. Let's do our part to ensure that our community has a safe, adequate and readily available blood supply. ##

Life Line Screening coming Oct. 22

Life Line Screening tests for Carotid Artery Blockage (most strokes are linked to carotid artery blockage), Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (Ruptured aortic aneurysms are the 13th leading cause of death in America!), Bone Density (screens for osteoporosis risk), and Peripheral Arterial Disease (the ABI test screens for blockage in the lower extremities, which often leads to P.A.D. and coronary disease). All three vascular screenings and A-fib are \$139 or with Bone density, \$149. Blood tests are also available offering a complete Lipid Panel, Glucose & C-Reactive Protein for \$99. You must pre-register by calling 1-800-324-1851. Sign up for the complete wellness package plus the 3 blood tests for only \$199. All tests will be conducted in our church fellowship room by Life Line Screening professionals. ##

We are beginning Adventurers on September 9, 2008. This is a Christian youth organization for children grades 1-4. We will be working on awards and events similar to Cub Scouts.

Adventurers will be held Tuesdays from 6:30 PM to 8:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall until the TJA gym is completed.

Each Adventurer child will need to be accompanied by an adult (18 or over) for the first month. After the first month, two families may "share" so that there is one adult per 2 children.

Needle nose pliers
Flashlight w/batteries
Mosquito repellent
Sunblock
Bandaids & ointment of choice


We will have our 2nd *Turbulent Times Financial Seminar* on October 10 & 11. Look for more information about this at church.
