



There Is A Way

After 26 years, I recently had the privilege of returning to my alma mater, Mokobokobo Primary School (nearly six hours northwest of Nairobi, Kenya).



On behalf of Ovision Consulting Group, I shared some words of encouragement and advice and donated and distributed much needed Covid-19

personal protective equipment supplies to more than 450 students and their teachers.

Great appreciation goes to my former teacher who is still a teacher at the school, Ms. Agnes Kemunto Makori, and my kid brother, William, who organized this very important event. Thereafter, I had a listening / consultative meeting with all teachers and later we were joined by two top leadership of the school Board of Management where both teams heartbreakingly narrated the challenges they are facing. The biggest challenge they are facing is the shortage of teachers. The school has 8 teachers to teach 450 students translating into a teacher: student ratio of 1:57 forcing the teachers to spend an inhuman amount of time to help the kids.

My wife, Irene, treated the teachers to a delicious lunch of mbuzi (a delicious stew of goat meat served with green vegetables such as kale) they



enjoyed very much. The event did not end without comic relief! During question time from students, one student told me that he took porridge without sugar in the morning and asked me if I could provide. I looked at him and saw that he really needed a uniform more than sugar, so he got a uniform instead to his surprise and disbelief! A few other needy students also benefited with complete school uniforms.

This school has many challenges. So I offered and asked them to pray for a solution. I also requested the Principal to form a special team to look into short and long term solutions and get back to me. Then we will prioritize and see how we are capable of helping. Thank you, Pastor Mike, for encouraging the church to "Leave the building." And thank you Toledo First Church for prayerfully considering how we can help this school too! ## Obed Ombongi

Meet Jackson, Our First New Member of 2021

Jackson is a student at University of Toledo, majoring in civil engineering. His family (father, mother, sisters and two brothers) lives in Ypsilanti, Michigan. But his story did not begin there.

Three quarters of Jackson's life – his childhood, teen years and twenties – were spent in a refugee camp with his family in Rwanda, a country in Central/Eastern Africa. His homeland was Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), which borders Rwanda on the west. The DRC is

the largest country in all of Africa. In 1996, when Jackson was just 7 years old, his family fled their home to escape persecution during tribunal wars that have been going on from the 1990s to the present. They ran, unable to take anything with them from their home. This Adventist family was thankful to escape with their lives!

They walked toward Rwanda and later were able to board a bus, which took them to the border of Rwanda. Eventually they arrived at a refugee camp where their needs (food, water, shelter) were provided by various agencies of the United Nations. Their new home: a tent. Their length of stay: 23 years. Jackson is thankful that he was able to attend school. But, he explains, "Life in refugee camps is the hardest one can think of. However, God has been great to us."



There are about 50,000 Congolese living in five refugee camps in Rwanda. The camp where Jackson's family lived held about 18,000 people. Among those living in the camp were many Seventh-day Adventists as "the Adventist church is big in Rwanda and eastern Congo." Refugees were, and still are, free to worship as they want, but they face challenges related to infrastructure—lack of church buildings, restrooms, etc.

When they fled their homeland they spoke their native language, Kinyarwanda. Jackson learned French in primary school (comparable to K-8) and that was also the language spoken in high school. However, he learned English when he was able to go outside the camp for university studies. His parents still speak only Kinyarwanda.

You may wonder how Jackson and his family finally arrived in America. Jackson explains, "When people are refugees and live in a refugee camp, they are under protection of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). When there is no hope to have peace restored in their country of origin so that refugees can be back to their homes, the UNHCR collaborates with developed countries and refugees who have been in camps for long (and who are lucky), can see themselves

flying to a country like USA, Canada or Australia. It is through this miraculous process that we immigrated to the USA in Feb 2019."

Asked if they had a choice of which country they would immigrate to, Jackson said, "We did not have a choice, we were just lucky to see ourselves in USA." He said there are many organizations



called "resettlement agencies" that help refugees when they first arrive.

Jackson is grateful for God's protection and provision. He said, "God has served us in war and we made our way to Rwanda. We lived in a refugee camp through a lot of hardships and we finally made it to USA. We lived on humanitarian aid for over 20 years. Many people are still in the refugee camps and we were no different. We just were blessed."

Jackson Nsengiyumva was baptized in Rwanda when he was 13 years old. On January 9, 2021, he was welcomed into membership by Pastor Mike and our Toledo First congregation. If you haven't met him, yet, won't you introduce yourself?
